# STUDENT REPORT CARDS James Whitla

As we navigate our way through the first year of the implementation of the Australian Curriculum, student report cards will reflect a student's achievement at the end of semester one and then again at the end of semester two, in the four subjects of English, Mathematics, Science and History thereby demonstrating progression over a period of 6 months. English and Mathematics are reported on from Prep - Year 6 and Science and History from Years 3-6 only. In these subjects your child's achievement level at the end of semester 1 is indicated by a partially filled dot and their achievement level for this semester's report marked by a solid dot. An example of a student who has achieved a normal 6 months growth in Semester 2 is included below:

As content in **all other learning areas** has not changed, student reports will continue to show 12 months progress for the end of semester student reports. In these subjects your child's achievement level at the end of **semester 2 in 2012** is marked by a hollow dot and their achievement level for **this semester's** report marked by a solid dot. An example of a student who has achieved a normal 12 months growth over the course of the year is included below:

The shaded column indicates a range where students are achieving the standards expected at that year level. # SCIENCE DAY Phillip Park 2B



On Wednesday 4 December, it was Science Day! On Science Day we did tons of experiments, like making slime and testing chemicals if they were acid or base.

I was in group 1 and our first activity was making "slime". Making the slime was pretty difficult because we had to mix it and test if we made it right.

The next activity was Colour Mixing. We had to mix red, yellow and blue, the primary colours.




# CHRISTMAS AT ASPENDALE TENNIS CLUB
