YOUR STATEMENT EXPLAINED

We understand that the Family Statements we send out are not always easy to understand—especially when you have credits on your account, either for EMA or credits for excursions or activities, where your child was absent.

However, these are part of the CASES21 system we use, and we cannot change them.

When you have a credit on your account, that credit sits there until you notify us of what you'd like to allocate it to—we cannot allocate these amounts automatically.

EMA can only be allocated to compulsory charges. It can be used to pay off camps, excursions, bulk supply charges etc;

When you receive your account, if you have any credits, those have already been deducted from the balance showing at the end—although as I already explained, these amounts have not been allocated to anything.

I would encourage anyone with a credit on their account, to give me a call to let me know what to allocate the money to, so we can get your account cleaned up—and issue a new statement, showing exactly what is still owing.


Next term we hope to have a disco in the early part of the term. Will let you know more as soon as we can.
