We will be trialling the new curriculum in Term 4 with a view to teaching the Vic Curriculum in its entirety from Day 1 of 2017 as decreed by the DET.

Much of it is the same as the current AusVels curriculum but there are a couple of tweaks that we have adapted - most noticeably in the capabilities that offer overarching skills and principles that all students should know and have in order to be successful citizens. The capabilities include:

- Personal and Social
- Critical and Creative Thinking
- Intercultural and
- Ethical

In doing some reading this week I stumbled across an article that discusses visual literacy and how we can ask questions of each other to stimulate conversation and expand vocabulary.

A timely reminder ...



If you can see skin, UV can reach it.

Between *September and the end of April 2016*, please ensure all children:

• Wear cool, loose fitting clothing that covers as much skin as possible



- Wear a sun protective hat for all outdoor activities
- Apply SPF 30 or higher broad spectrum sunscreen during the day (please see sunscreen tips below)
- Have access to shady play spaces
- Wear wrap-around sunglasses labelled AS 1067 (if practical).

SUNSCREEN TIPS

- Regular use of sunscreen has been shown to reduce the incidence of melanoma and squamous cell carcinoma, both in the short and long term.
- Choose SPF 30 or higher broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen. Make sure it is within its use-by date and is stored below 30 degrees. It is best to apply a generous amount of sunscreen to any exposed skin around 20 minutes before going outdoors. Sunscreen should be reapplied every two hours even if the stated level of water resistance is 4 hours.
- Store sunscreen with lunchboxes and/ or hats so when children grab their lunch or hat before going outdoors, they will also be reminded to apply sunscreen. If sunscreen is kept in the cooler section of the lunchbox, it will be cold when applying especially nice on a hot, summer's day.

Safety in Tackers is paramount. As well as providing life jackets (PFDs) there will be a safety boat on the water at all times when the kids are on the water. Weather conditions are checked prior to all sessions and kids will be under the supervision of gualified Yachting Australia Instructors, who are first aid trained.



Do I need to be a member of a vacht club to take part in a Tackers program?

You do not need be a yacht club member to take part in a Tackers program at a recognised Yachting Australia Tackers Club.

Bo I need a boat to start sulling through Tackers?

No, the boats are provided by the Tackers Club for use during the program.

Will I be sailing on my own?

Tackers is a program delivered to small groups of participants of the same level of ability. In Tackers 1 - Having Fun, participants sail in pairs to become familiar with the skills needed to sail. In Tackers 2 - Tricks & Techniques and Tackers 3 - Sailing Fast! participants sail in a boat alone, but with close supervision from qualified Yachting Australia Instructors and Assistant Instructors.

What happens after Tackers 3 - Sailing Fast?

It can take several sailing seasons to complete all three levels of Tackers. After Tackers 3 participants are encouraged to take part in 'Green Fleet' at their local club. Green Fleet is a combination of fun/games based sailing and 'novice' racing. Some time is spent playing on water games and destination sailing and some time spent in a novice race coaching environment NNW. discoversalling.org.au/tackers
