Wellbeing Education at Edithvale Primary - Circle Time

The wellbeing of our students underpins everything we do at school. Our values program "Bounce Back" teaches students to be resilient and to respect others. One of the ways we help our students to get on well is to involve them in an activity called "Circle Time."

The class forms a circle so that everyone can be seen and their contribution valued. The students agree that what is said stays in the circle to allow them to be open and honest with each other. Discussions are non judgemental and personal responsibility is emphasised. This is an essential element when solving problems between students. This forum is then used as part of the curriculum to develop "Speaking and Listening" skills. Issues that are important to the students are discussed which are relevant to them personally and as members of the wider community. Students can explore their experiences and balance them against the experiences and views of others.

This performs the two fold task of teaching speaking and listening skills in real life situations. It also allows the students to gain self-knowledge and explore relationships, feelings and emotions in a safe and secure environment.

Circle Time brings teachers and students together in an enjoyable way where they can celebrate achievements and good times, share knowledge or work, solve problems that occur between class members or just have fun and get to know each other better. This all leads to students learning better because they feel safe, supported and appreciated at school.

Benefits include:

Increased thinking skills such as being able to concentrate, predict, question, evaluate and recount in an effective manner.

- Encouragement of an acceptance of others, openness and caring
- Development of interpersonal skills such as the ability to listen, explain feelings, encourage others in a positive way and develop public speaking skills.

Madison Klusik - In Circle Time I can give my views and express my opinion. It makes me feel good because I know people are listening to me and showing me respect, it makes the whole grade feel great.

Bridget Cameron - We reflect on what is good and also our feelings. We can express ourselves in the group, not feel lonely or that what we do is different from everyone else.

Ellie Lockard - Circle Time gives us a chance to have our say. Whether it's a game we play or a piece of work we can share our ideas and know we will be supported and respected.

Thomas Milne -Circle Time to me is all about how you feel about something and listening to other people's opinions. When we do it I can tell that other people are interested in what the class has to say and it makes our class closer because we can all see each other and everyone has a turn.
