SCHOOL FEES AND CHARGES Sandie Wishart—Business Manager

All charges paid via OfficeMax have now been received by the School, and receipted against family accounts. All families should have received a copy of their statement by now. If you have not received one, please let me know and I will email one to you, or send a copy home with your child.

Please note that due to changes in the **Department's processes, Voluntary Contributions** do not show on your statements now, until they have been paid. Voluntary contributions set by School Council are:

- ◆ Curriculum Program \$100.00 per child.
- Buildings Upkeep \$ 35.00 per child.
- Student First Aid Care \$ 20.00 per child.

Voluntary financial contributions are for school facilities and equipment not associated with providing the standard curriculum program otherwise provided for through the Student Resource Program, which help to fund many programs and resources that benefit your child and that would otherwise not be offered at EPS.

If you are in receipt of CSEF (Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund), we are expecting this money to arrive very soon. I will allocate it on your behalf, to your most urgent compulsory charges—such as Year 5/6 Camp, which took place over the last three days of week 8. If there are no compulsory charges remaining on your account, the CSEF funds will stay on your account as a credit until needed.

Note: CSEF funds can only be used for camps, excursions, activities and sporting events, such as interschool sport and swimming.

LATE ARRIVALS/EARLY LEAVERS

A reminder to all parents/guardians that if your child is late for school, or you are picking them up early, you are required to sign in or out at the office. Please do not go straight to the classroom. When you have signed in/out, you will be given a pass to take to the teacher. If your child comes in on their own, please direct them to the office first for a pass.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND [CSEF]

Parents are reminded that if you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for the CSEF.

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. The annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 for primary school students

How to Apply: Contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form. Complete the form and return it with a copy of your Health Care/Pension card. Applications close 3 June 2016.

Allocation of Funds: We will allocate your CSEF as it becomes available, to your most urgent outstanding compulsory charges (school camps, excursions, activities & sporting events and will then send you a statement, so you know exactly where the money has been allocated to.

CSEF can not be allocated to voluntary contributions.

If you cannot locate the expiry date on your card, then please give me a call so I can check our records for you. Note that if you name Edithvale **Primary School as your place of 'volunteering';,** we automatically get a copy of your card sent to us also.

*Renewal must occur within three months of card expiring, after this time people must complete a new application at the higher fee. (Volunteer cards are always free).

These changes follow the government's review of the fee structure to ensure:

- Savings generated for some services are passed on.


The small-talk Supported Playgroup is funded by the Department of Education and Training and is available for families who have a Health Care Card or equivalent.


