WHEELTALK DISABILITY AWARENESS PROGRAM Angelo Mavroudis

On Monday the Year 5/6s had the Disability, Sport and Recreation WheelTalk program come to our school and talk to us about life with a disability and wheelchair basketball.

Orfeo and Gary gave us a talk about why they are in a wheelchair, how being disabled has affected their lives and how playing sport helps them to stay fit and active.

Gary's accident was at work when he fell through the floor of a two storey building, broke his back and was paralysed from the waist down. He now hand-cycles and has cycled around Cambodia, Laos, Vietnam, Fiji and Thailand.

Orfeo was hit by a drunk-driver and broke both his legs and had to have them amputated. He went on to represent Australia in wheelchair basketball in the 1996 Paralympics in Atlanta and won a gold medal.

After the talk we went outside to play wheelchair basketball. Everyone had fun but it was hard (not for me) and we were all exhausted at the end of the day!


