# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT Denise Webster

I hope you enjoyed the holiday break and took time to relax and recharge the batteries. Term 4 is always eventful however, as always, our focus is on ensuring that students are on track with their learning so that they are prepared for the move into the next year level in 2014.

Please remember that the wearing of hats is compulsory for Term 4 - our Sunsmart policy determines that 'no hat, no play' - so any student without a hat will need to sit in the covered areas during recess and lunchtime. This also applies to Sport and Physical Education lessons. The uniform shop is open on Tuesdays between 3.00 pm and 4.00 pm if you need to restock.

#### **OVAL UPGRADE**
