PRINCIPAL'S REPORT Denise Webster

On Tuesday evening we held the first of our Parent Information sessions in the Learning Centre. The focus was on giving parents an understanding of our Curriculum Framework and the way we structure our teaching and learning programs. Parents were then given the opportunity to connect with classroom teachers and find out information that was more specifically related to their child's year level. Our next session for parents of students in Years 1-3 will be on Monday 17 February from 6-7pm in the Learning Centre.

Earlier in the week teachers were involved in a professional learning session with Mathematics expert, Charles Lovitt, where he inspired us as he shared his love of all things mathematical. We came away with a vast array of ideas and activities to use in our classrooms as well as a greater understanding of how to assist our students as they connect with mathematics.

EMERGENCY DRILL Mr James Whitla

Next Wednesday 19 February, we will be conducting an EMERGENCY LOCK DOWN DRILL for every class in our school. Emergency procedure drills will be held randomly throughout the year and next



week's practice is designed to support our students to become accustomed to moving in a safe, calm and orderly fashion to designated safety points throughout the school.

Staff will explain the expectations and requirements of our students step by step and expose them to the sounds of the alarm and loud speakers. This familiarisation will help prepare our students for a full scale evacuation FIRE DRILL that we will conduct later in Term 1.

All parents on the school premises at the time of the Lock down will be asked to join in this emergency procedure too, which will only take 5-10 minutes.

ALTERNATE FAMILIES

It is important that we keep our student confidential details up to date. If your family's living arrangements have changed and the parents are no longer living together, we need to know the details of the 'alternative' family for our records. The 'primary' family is usually where the child spends the most time. The 'alternative' family is usually the other parent, who the child does not normally live with, but spends time with. If they spend half of their time at each address, we need the two 'families' listed separately.

We are aware that there a number of families in our school community who are in this situation but we still have the parents recorded as being at the same address.

If this includes you, would you please pop into the office (or give Pru a call) and complete an 'alternative family' form, so we can update our records accordingly.

Not only does this help us understand your child's living arrangements, but it also alerts us to those parents who need an extra copy of reports etc; sent home.

EMA APPLICATIONS—FINAL REMINDER

Educational Maintenance Allowance (EMA) applications are due in to school by 28 February 2013, for those holding a current Health Care or Pension Card. Application forms are available from the office.

SCHOOL FEES & CHARGES PAYING BY INSTALMENTS

If you elected to pay your school charges in three instalments; and provided your credit card details; the first instalment was deducted on 10 & 11 February.

If you chose to pay by BPay or Cheque, and have not yet done so, would you please make the payment at your earliest convenience.

We hope that this method makes it a little easier for you to manage your charges over the year. There is still time to choose this option, just pop into the office to complete an instalment form.

The second instalment is due on **28 April** and the third, on **28 July**.

PAYING BY BPAY

Another option when paying your school charges, is to set up a scheduled payment for \$25 each fortnight (or an amount that suits you). Let Sandie know, and then when the payments come through, she will allocate it for you. Statements will be sent home soon, once we receive the reconciliation from OfficeMax, showing all of your payments. The BPay details are on your statement. If you need the details before then, please pop in or call the office and we will provide them for you.

From Department of Education and Early Childhood Development EVERY DAY COUNTS SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future - a student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By Year 10 they'll have missed more than a year of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Coming to school every day is vital, but if for any reason your child must miss school, there are things we can do together to ensure they don't fall behind:

- Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.
- Develop an absence learning plan with your teacher and ensure your child completes the plan.

Remember, every day counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher early as early as possible.

From 1 March 2014, new laws will mean that parents can be fined for not sending students to school without an acceptable reason.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.

SUNSMART

A timely reminder.... If you can see skin, UV can reach it.

From *September to the end of April*, please ensure all children:

- Wear cool, loose fitting clothing that covers as much skin as possible
- Wear a sun protective hat for all outdoor activities
- Apply SPF 30 or higher broad spectrum sunscreen during the day (please see sunscreen tips below)
- Have access to shady play spaces
- Wear wrap-around sunglasses labelled AS 1067 (if practical)

SUNSCREEN TIPS

- Regular use of sunscreen has been shown to reduce the incidence of melanoma and squamous cell carcinoma, both in the short and long term.
- Choose SPF 30 or higher broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen. Make sure it is within its use-by date and is stored below 30 degrees. It is best to apply a generous amount of sunscreen to any exposed skin around 20 minutes before going outdoors. Sunscreen should be reapplied every two hours even if the stated level of water resistance is 4 hours.
- Store sunscreen with lunchboxes and/ or hats so when children grab their lunch or hat before going outdoors, they will also be reminded to apply sunscreen. If sunscreen is kept in the cooler section of the lunchbox, it will be cold when applying especially nice on a hot, summer's day.


