PRINCIPAL'S REPORT Mr James Whitla

I am delighted to be able to provide you with some updates on our staffing and grade structures for 2016.

Firstly, and importantly, we will be saying farewell to one of our longest serving members of staff, Mrs. Liz Walton, our cleaner extraordinaire. Liz has been cleaning and polishing our school for over 28 years and we have been blessed to have such a wonderful support over the years.

On Tuesday we conducted interviews as we aim to secure our next substantive Assistant Principal. It gives me much pleasure to announce that Mr. Andrew Schneider has been appointed to this position. Andrew comes to us from St Kilda Park Primary School where he has been both the Assistant Principal and Acting principal this year. He is a local family man with 3 young children and has strong community ties with local sporting organisations. Andrew brings a wealth of knowledge that bely his years and I am excited at his appointment as he will help us become a truly great school.

I am pleased to announce also that Mrs Jane Hayes will also be re-joining us in a part time capacity after an **extra break. Jane's enthusiasm, knowledge and skills** add much experience to our teaching staff. We are delighted also to have secured Mr Scott Chalwell on a Full Time basis next year.

Overall the school size will slightly increase from 313

students in February this year to approximately 320 students in 2016.

Again there will be three classes that share two teachers each. Further information, including 2016 class teachers, will be published in a few weeks time. As previously noted, we often receive requests regarding class placements. We certainly consider all of these requests in isolation, however there are times that these cannot always be acted upon. Teachers use their considerable knowledge and educational expertise when compiling class lists and their professional judgement invariably ensure balanced classes for the following year.

Students have all provided us with a list of 5 friends that they feel they will work well with and we have ensured that each child has been placed with at least one of his or her friends in 2016. It is also relevant to note that as we continue to teach collaboratively across the school in a range of open learning spaces, students will continue to work with students across their year levels with different teachers throughout the year.

Finally, our Leadership Team and staff have been working on developing next year's Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) that sets out our goals and strategies for 2016. Our 2 key Priorities will be Excellence in Teaching and Learning and Professional Leadership. We have been working closely with Department of Education and Training leaders to help create a robust plan that includes ambitious and achievable goals. Once this plan has been finalised, we will make it available on the website so that our whole school community can help us implement the plan and make our school a truly great school.


