PRINCIPAL'S REPORT Denise Webster

Back in March I wrote about the work that we would be involved in over the course of 2013 relating to our school's Self-Evaluation and Review. Initial activities have already involved all staff members and small groups of students as well as school councillors. As we head into the second half of the year, our efforts in this process will increase. We will assess the progress that has been made over the past 4 years. We have made some significant gains in a number of areas and this will give us an opportunity to highlight these achievements and celebrate our successes. Our analysis of different data sets will also highlight where our next focus for work will be. We will investigate those areas for improvement and design our new 4 year strategic plan in the light of these.

A key element of the review process is that we take this opportunity to engage directly with you - to get your opinion on a range of features from the most recent plan: how we have travelled; where we need to focus our attention next. Currently we are planning a range of activities that we can use to gather information. This might be in the form of a feedback sheet; it may be through the establishment of focus groups. We really do value your ideas and opinions so we ask that if and when you are invited to share your thoughts, that you assist us by participating.

What is AusVELS?

AusVELS is the Victorian curriculum for government schools. This curriculum framework was introduced in 2013 for Prep to Year 10 students. The first four Australian Curriculum subjects: English. Mathematics, Science and History have been incorporated into the already established VELS framework and renamed AusVELS. The remaining Australian Curriculum subjects will be implemented progressively over time. Schools are at different and varying stages of implementation in this first year of AusVELS. However, assessment of student achievement continues to be against the curriculum students have been taught. In Semester 1, your child's report will reflect an on-balance judgement against the achievement standards for AusVELS.

How have student reports changed for Semester 1 2013?

The four subjects of English, Mathematics, Science and History have new achievement standards which will be used for the first time in student reporting for Semester 1, 2013.

As this is a transition year with a new curriculum, progress in these four subjects will not be linked to 2012 achievement data. In Semester 1, a single dot will indicate on-balance judgement of student achievement against the new achievement standards for each of the four subjects of English, Mathematics, Science and History on the student report.

Therefore your child's end of Semester 2 student report will show six month progress from June 2013 to December 2013 in the four subjects of English, Mathematics, Science and History.



You will find a further, more detailed explanation on the inside front cover of your child's report.

For your convenience, BPay is available to all families. The BPay codes are shown on your Family Statement-which is sent to you each term, or just phone the office for details. Please only use BPay for amounts of \$20 or over; (you can bundle several payments together) and please email or send a note to school, so we know what to allocate your payment to.

What will my child's report card look like at the end of Semester 1, 2013?

Student report cards will look the same as reports in the past, including the use of the A to E scale. However, the Australian curriculum subjects of English, Mathematics, Science and History contain new achievement standards and therefore June reports will show a single dot only to indicate achievement for the semester. Six months progress in these subjects will be shown in the December 2013 report.



As content in all other learning areas has not changed, your child's report will continue to show 12 months progress for most of the other subjects in both the June and December student reports.




