PRINCIPAL'S REPORT Mrs Denise Webster

The work on our oval is well underway and we are very proud of the way in which the students are managing the use of the restricted yard area. With the additional 'extra-curricular' activities involving many more students, the impact of this reduction in space has been minimised. We are all looking forward to seeing the oval come to life again.

Many thanks to the teachers and parents who are working together to make our swimming program a very successful experience for all involved. There is a great deal of behind the scenes work that enables everything to run smoothly and we appreciate the support that we get from our parent community.

Thank you to parents who have informed us of changed arrangements for 2014. Please let us know as soon as possible if your child is not attending EPS next year, as we are about to begin the process of constructing classes and designing our transition program for later in the term. If you have any additional information you believe is relevant to us about your child's learning needs as we begin this process, please let me know as soon as possible. Please note, however, that this is not an invitation to request particular teachers. Determining the composition of classes for 2014 is a comprehensive process and consideration is given to the needs of all students.

Important Note to Parents/Guardians

Under the *Public Health and Wellbeing Act 2008*, schools are required to:

- request information from parents on the immunisation status of each child prior to enrolment
- take a copy of the sighted document and record information on the immunisation status of each enrolled child.

Most recent figures indicate that 20-25 per cent of Victorian primary school entrants are not meeting this legislative requirement to present an

immunisation status certificate when enrolling in primary school. In the event of an infectious disease outbreak, unimmunised children and children whose immunisation status is unknown because no certificate has been presented may be excluded from attending school until the risk of infection has passed.

The most common type of immunisation status certificate is a *Child History Statement* from the Australian Childhood Immunisation Register (ACIR). Parents are sent a statement when their child turns five; however they can request a statement from ACIR at any time.

If this documentation has not already been provided to the school for your child, you will receive a letter from us next week. Please assist us by forwarding a copy of the relevant certificate so that we can meet our departmental responsibilities.

Did you know that OpenDNS offers free web filtering and monitoring solutions that parents block allow to websites? It's based categories, such as "Adult", "Gambling", Academic Fraud" and "Weapons". There are 56 categories that can be blocked.




The OpenDNS Home solution requires no software installation. It's as simple as signing up for a free "Home" account at www.opendns.com, selecting your categories, and then making a small and easy change to your Internet Router. Once enabled, all the computers and devices in your home using WiFi will have the categories you selected filtered. Instead of viewing the unwanted website, you will be presented with a page saying the site has been blocked.

Additional tools are available on the **OpenDNS** portal that will provide statistics of what websites were visited on your network. If you see problem web sites in your network stats, you can easily block them as well.
