
PRINCIPAL'S REPORT Mr James Whitla

We have had an incredible fortnight here at Edithvale Primary. Our Inquiry into the Olympics concluded last week with a fantastic open afternoon and closing ceremony and it was great to see and hear of the learning our students had done throughout the previous fortnight! We will continue to prompt and extend our students' thinking by asking higher order questions of them all during classes. Questions such as 'What might be a solution to....?' and 'What changes could you make to ensure a better outcome to....?' are the types of questions we are asking to help our students think critically and creatively.

Our 2016 NAPLAN data has been delivered to our school and I am delighted to share with our school community the many good news stories that are contained within the data. Our growth in all Literacy areas from Year 3 to Year 5 continues to be greater than the State average and there are many positive trends that have started in both Year levels. We will continue to relentlessly pursue outstanding results and outcomes and will not rest until we are continually in the top echelon of schools in the State.

The community spirit that abounds at Edithvale is unique and it was great to see so many families invested in the upgrade and upkeep of our school grounds at our most recent working bee. We had current students, grandparents, representatives from families who have only recently started at the school and past students who wanted to give back to our great school. You may have seen the planter boxes around the school that have been filled with plants and vegies, the re-construction of boxes by the basketball courts, planting of grasses by the French Avenue school entrance and the upgrading of the irrigation system in the vegie patch at the back of the oval. These tasks were able to be completed by using the voluntary contributions and donations

that we receive as part of our fees, from our families each year.

POTATO OLYMPICS

What an exciting two weeks it has been with our inquiry into the Olympics. During this time, all year levels also completed a Maths300 activity using, believe it or not, potatoes. Maths300 is a resource of activities that allow students to apply mathematical skills and concepts while problem solving.

This Maths300 activity 'POTATO OLYMPICS' asks the students to orchestrate, create or design an Olympic event their potatoes can participate in. Each year level differentiated the activity to suit students' learning needs. Some year levels even named and created descriptions of their potato athlete (or 'spudlete'). The events ranged from rolling down a 'hill' to diving and creating a splash. Here are some pictures that captured some of these exciting moments from each year level:

The Year 1s had a great time thinking of events for their spudletes to compete in.






