PARENT INFORMATION SESSIONS

Both the senior and junior school parent information sessions were well attended and we have had very positive feedback from a number of parents who attended. Please note that these sessions replace the Parent Partnership meetings that we have run in recent years. However, you are always welcome to make an appointment if you want to have a more specific or detailed discussion with the classroom teacher about your child's progress or learning needs.

ATTENDANCE

The Department of Education and Early Childhood Development has launched a new campaign which focuses on the need for children to attend school on a regular basis. You may have seen some posters around the school that highlight that 'Every Day Counts'.

"We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day... Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day - missing school puts them behind."

Last year our students were absent for a total of 3902.5 days, this is an average of nearly 13 days per student. Sometimes there are very good reasons for non-attendance; unfortunately there are still many instances (30%) where the absence is either unapproved or unexplained. You can help us by sending a written note if your child *is going to be* away or *has been* away. Please talk to your child's teacher if your child is anxious about coming to school. Being late for school also has a significant impact on your child's learning - being present at the start of the day is crucial to students' understanding of what is expected of them throughout the day.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

Every year half the positions on School Council are up for re-election. The election process for School Council 2014 has now concluded. Four nominations were received for the four vacant positions and as a result the following parents were duly elected without the need for a ballot. ALTERNATE FAMILIES

It is important that we keep our student confidential details up to date. If your family's living arrangements have changed and the parents are no longer living together, we need to know the details of the 'alternate' family for our records. The 'primary' family is usually where the child spends the most time. The 'alternate' family is usually the other parent, who the child does not normally live with; but spends time with. If they spend half of their time at each address, we need the two 'families' listed separately.

We are aware that there a number of families in our school community who are in this situation but have not notified us, so we still have the parents recorded as being at the same address.

If you are in this situation, would you please pop into the office (or give Pru a call) and complete an 'alternative family' form, so we can update our records accordingly.

Not only does this help us understand your child's living arrangements, but it also alerts us to those parents who need an extra copy of reports etc; sent home.



FAMILY STATEMENTS SCHOOL FEES & CHARGES

All families should have now received their first statement for the year, outlining all charges and showing all monies receipted, including any charges paid via OfficeMax. If you have any queries about your statement, please give Sandie a call on 9772 1393. If you have credits that need to be allocated, please phone, or send a note along to school letting us know what to allocate the credit to.

Thank you to those who have paid all of their charges so promptly. These payments assist us in providing your children with a wider range of Curricular and Extra-Curricular programs.

If you have not made any payments yet, could you please do so at your earliest convenience. Thank you. For your convenience, there are several payment options available to you:

1. BPay

This is the safest, and most convenient method of payment. Just make your payment (the BPay details are on your statement) and send an email or a note along to school, letting us know what your payment is intended for. Once the payment has been received and allocated, a statement will be sent home for your information. BPay payments should be for \$20 or more, due to the bank charges incurred.

2. Instalments

It is not too late to elect to pay your School charges by three instalments. Just pop into the office and fill out a form, include your credit card details, and we will deduct the first instalment now, the second on 28 April and the third on 28 July.

3. Scheduled Payments

Set up a scheduled payment using your banking software, and pay \$25-\$50 (or whatever you can afford) each week or fortnight. Sandie will then allocate this to the most appropriate charges and send you a statement so you can see where you are up to.

4. Pay by Cash or Credit Card

Of course you can still pay by cash or credit card, using the reply/payment slips provided to you. Payment envelopes are available from the School office.

Please note, sales are CASH only and we cannot change large bills.


