
WRITERS CORNER Mr Luke McMaster

1. BPay

This is the safest, most convenient method of payment. You will find the BPay details are on your statement). BPay payments should be for \$20 or more, due to the bank charges incurred.

2. Instalments

Just pop into the office and fill out an instalment form including your credit card details, and we will deduct the instalments on your behalf.

3. Scheduled Payments

Set up a scheduled payment using your banking software, and pay whatever you can afford each week or fortnight.

4. Pay by Cash or Credit Card

Send cash or a credit card payment to school, using the reply/payment slips provided to you.

RENEW YOUR WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK ONLINE



From early April 2014, cardholders who are required to renew their WWC Check will no longer need to go to Australia Post to lodge a paper form and present their current card.

From this time, cardholders will go to the WWC Check website to complete their renewal application online and, if applying for an Employee Check, pay the fee using a credit card.

Cardholders will be notified by SMS, letter or email 28 days before their WWC Check is due to expire. It is important for cardholders to keep their contact details up to date so that they receive this important reminder.

After receiving notification, a individuals continuing to do child-related work should go to MyCheck on the WWC Check website and apply to renew their Check. Cardholders will be asked to register with MyCheck if they have not already done so. Once logged in to MyCheck, cardholders will be prompted to confirm or update their personal contact and work details, complete the online form and, if applying for an Employee Check, pay the non-refundable \$102.70 fee.




