As many of you are aware the year 3's been studying Melbourne. Part of our topic has been for the children to make a model of a Melbourne Icon. The students have done a brilliant job. Room 16 has continued to use their models by learning about ways we could make some of our icons environmentally friendly. The children have come up with some great ideas from putting wind turbines on the Royal Children's Hospital to using mirrors to supply light to Captain Cooks Cottage and the Old Melbourne Goal. All our buildings now have a water saving devise, recycling facilities and most are solar powered. The scientific ideas and designs have been a credit to the students.

As a result of our great work, two of the icons, a tram built by Laird and the Rialto built by Tiara are going to represent Edithvale Primary School at Parkmore Shopping Centre in their Save the Environment Expo. Unfortunately we could not include all our buildings. The children have all written about their experience and we have made a book that I am hoping will be displayed as well.
