There were so many visitors to our school on this day and there were many, many compliments about the way in which the celebration was organised. A key focus of the day was in creating opportunities for past students, parents and teachers to relive their days at EPS. The success of this could be seen in the 'catch up' rooms - the 1950s was particularly hard to get into because there were countless people sharing stories and rekindling long forgotten memories.
