#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT Mr James Whitla

It is always wonderful taking school tours for interested families and I am constantly blown away by the engaging and inviting interactions our students continue to have with each other, our staff and our new families. I am very proud of the way they showcase many great aspects of our school.

If you can feel excitement in the air, it's probably stemming from Concert Fever!! Our students and staff are very excited at the prospect of performing on the big stage next week. The meticulous planning and creative foresight that our staff and students have incorporated into this year's Concert is sure to have you smiling and entertained.

Last week our 2017 **NAPLAN** results arrived and, overall, they are a terrific set of results for us. Pleasingly the growth in our year 5 cohort over the last 2 years has far outstripped the state average in all 5 Domains (Reading, Writing, Numeracy, Spelling and Grammar & Punctuation). This growth is a key measure that the Department uses to determine a school's effectiveness.

NAPLAN results play an important role in our school improvement journey. Standardised testing can benefit our schools system wide; and broadly speaking, NAPLAN testing is the DET's measure to gauge the needs of education in Victoria.

It also gives an indication where schools are not performing to where they should be so that intervention can be put in place. A recent whole school Review (that all schools go through every 4 years) identified a couple of areas for us to focus on in the next few years and with our relentless pursuit of excellence in full swing, we will keep refining our practices to ensure our upward NAPLAN trend continues.

Of equal, and possibly even more, interest to me was the wonderful feedback we received from our students via the **Student Attitudes to School** Survey. These indicated that our students are engaged and motivated in a stimulating learning environment. Ensuring that the environment we provide here at Edithvale is supportive and safe, is a key platform of ours. It was fantastic to note that the hard work of our staff is having a positive impact on the academic, social and emotional wellbeing of our students.

Our recent external Peer Review has been completed and a DRAFT report has been written to help us start thinking about our Vision and Goals for our great school over the next 4 years. I'm hopeful that this will be made available in the coming weeks. Preliminary goals centre around increasing Student Voice, continuing to make strong connections with the community and developing excellence in teaching and learning.

In summary, we're certainly on the right track!

Our athletics team again proudly represented our school today. The comradery, support and the encouragement our students gave their teammates, helped inspire them to reach great heights. Congratulations to all participants on their efforts and achievements.

A reminder that next Friday 1 September there is a student free day here at school. Our staff will be undertaking professional learning on how to incorporate **Project Based Inquiry Learning** into our stimulating curriculum. The Kingston Council are offering to run an all day program on site (numbers permitting).
