New Classrooms

This week has seen a hive of activity in and around our new relocatable classrooms and they should be ready for handover next week in readiness for our transition mornings. The new classrooms have had power connected and been plumbed and we are just waiting for the carpet to go down and have the stairs and landings built. We will then put in an order for new furniture and be ready to go for 2018. Next year our Year 3s will be the first cohort to work in this space. How exciting!

Class Structures for Next Year.

The final round of interviewing for 2018 staff is almost complete and once this has been confirmed we will begin to appoint staff to each level of the school in preparation for next year. Last week we conducted interviews for two of the three positions available and it gives me great delight to announce that Ms Sienna von Menge, who completed her 4th year placement under the mentoring of Jaime Rohan this year, and Ms Elizabeth Watts, currently teaching at Hampton Primary School, will be joining our dedicated staff next year. We still have one position to fill and this will be done in the next fortnight - with the aim to have the successful applicant here for our transition days.

This week, after hours and hours of deliberating, discussion and input from all teachers, we managed to complete our class lists for 2018. I'd like to take the opportunity to publically thank our staff for the care and thought they invested into creating such balanced class lists. It is a comprehensive process undertaken by our teaching team each year. It involves many hours of consideration and the overriding goal is to achieve a balance of competencies across each class at each level. The factors that are analysed to achieve this balance include a spread of academic abilities and a mixture of social skills and behavioural characteristics. The final part of this process also involves consideration being given to friendship preferences, however in some cases friendship preferences of students may not be facilitated if teachers feel that it is in the best interests of a student to separate him/her from another student.

We are very fortunate that we have such a competent and dedicated teaching staff and I have complete confidence that all children will continue to be challenged and nurtured in all of our classes.

Music Opportunity 2018

On Thursday 7 December, at 10:30am, there will be a Music workshop held by MUSICORP for all of our students interested in learning a musical instrument next year. After a demonstration of the different musical instruments (electrical and acoustic) the musicians will be handing out information on what their program consists of. Mark, from Jack in the Box music, will still be offering his classes next year as well.

Parent Helpers' Morning Tea

We are very much looking forward to celebrating the volunteer work done by so many of our amazing parents and friends this year at a special morning tea in the staff room next Friday. If you haven't let us know you are attending, please do so, for catering purposes.

Transition Dates

Our extensive student transition for 2018 has already commenced for a few year levels and students; and on 12– 14 December each morning before recess, our students will be introduced to their classroom teacher and classmates. The purpose of these transition days centres around student wellbeing, resilience and a growth mindset as we seek to highlight the opportunities that this change brings. I know that our staff are really excited about what 2018 could hold and we are all looking forward to going on a great

learning journey together in 2018.

Our final assembly for the year will be held on Thursday 21 December at 12:45pm. At this assembly we will thank and farewell our graduating class of 2018 and introduce our new student leaders. School will conclude at 1:30pm for students. Team Holiday will be running their Before and After School care program on this day and their Vacation Care program will start in early January.




