SCHOOL FEES/CHARGES/QKR/TIQBIZ Sandie Wishart—Business Manager

A huge thank you to the many families who have paid their 2017 School Fees/Charges so quickly. These have been allocated to family accounts now, along with any small credits/refunds that remained on your accounts from 2016. These were allocated to compulsory/optional charges only, not voluntary contributions. Note that voluntary contributions will not be shown on your family accounts, until they have been paid.

A family statement will be sent home once all transactions have been processed. You can make your payments any time, using the QKR app on your smart phone or device or by BPay (the BPay codes are included on your family statement).

Please also be reminded that you need to update your child's year level and class on QKR, and you will also need to deselect the year level your child was previously attached to in Tiqbiz, and subscribe to the correct year levels for this year. This can be done by clicking on the three small lines at the top right hand side of your screen, when in Tiqbiz. If you need help with either QKR or Tiqbiz, please feel free to pop into the office and we will be happy to help.

LATE ARRIVALS/EARLY LEAVERS

A reminder to all parents/guardians that if your child is late for school, or you are picking them up early, you are required to sign in or out at the office. Please do not go straight to the classroom. When you have signed in/out, you will be given a pass to take to the teacher. If your child comes in on their own, please direct them to the office first for a pass. Thank you for your help with this procedure.



EMERGENCY DRILL

In the coming weeks, we will be conducting an EMERGENCY LOCK DOWN DRILL for every class in our school. Emergency procedure drills will be held randomly throughout the year and this practice is designed to support our students to become accustomed to moving in a safe, calm and orderly fashion to designated safety points throughout the school.

Staff will explain the expectations and requirements of our students step by step and expose them to the sounds of the alarm and loud speakers. This familiarisation will help prepare our students for a full scale evacuation FIRE DRILL that we will conduct later in Term 1.

All parents on the school premises at the time of the lock down will be asked to join in this emergency procedure too, which will only take 5-10 minutes.

EDI'S MATHS CORNER

At Edithvale we are passionate about the learning and teaching of Maths and continue to plan challenging and creative tasks in order to get our students excited about learning in Maths.

Our Maths program is focused on a set of teaching that students work through sequences developmentally to ensure they have a solid understanding of concepts. It is essential for students to build a strong foundation in order to avoid gaps in their learning later on in their school life. Throughout the school, Maths is taught to a particular structure which includes a number fluency activity (for example: Finger Maths), launch (hooking the students in, telling them what they are learning), discovery (the activity) and a summary (reflection). All teachers use specific Maths language appropriate to their level that enhances the content (for example, using the word 'add' instead of plus, multiplication facts instead of times tables).

You can keep up to date with the Maths being taught in your child's classroom by reading the year level newsletters each term. To help with Maths learning at home we have included a link to suggestions of maths related apps you might like to try at home.

CSEF

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 for primary school students

CENTREPAY



Edithvale Primary School has registered with Centrepay.

Centrepay is a free direct bill paying service available to parents/guardians who receive an Australian Government Department of Human Services Centrelink payment, family assistance payment or Parental Leave Pay.

Payments can be made directly to the school and credited to your child's account It can be used to pay for school charges, camps and excursions.

STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

A reminder that neither the School nor the Department, provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents/Guardians are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs.

Student accident insurance policies are available from some commercial insurers.


