Review

Today and on Friday next week, we will be undergoing our 4 yearly School Review. Our self evaluation and survey results have helped us identify strengths and potential areas of improvement that we can focus on over the next 4 years.

On Friday we will be setting the 'Terms of Reference' (ToR) with the group - Principal, Assistant Principal, SEIL (my boss), School Council President, Challenge Partners and School Reviewer (Zenda Clarke). This will include setting 3 or 4 questions that will be used as a lens to review our last strategic plan. These might be, for example, something along the lines of 'How have our school values supported student learning?' or 'To what extent have the programs introduced over the last 4 years influenced student growth?"

Parent Opinion Survey 2017

WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents at each school.

It is designed to assist our school in gaining an understanding of parents' perception of school climate, student engagement and relationships with our parent community. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

The survey will be conducted **online by ORIMA Research Pty Ltd** and only takes **15 minutes** to complete. The survey can be accessed via desktop computer, laptop, tablet or mobile at any convenient time within the fieldwork period from **Monday 7 August** to **Sunday 27 August**.

A random sample of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous.

The online survey is available in English, Arabic,



Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (Hakha) and Hindi. Survey language guides will be available if required.

The survey results will be reported back to our school at the end of September and the results will be communicated to parents.

NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA

Since 2015, all Australian schools have been required to participate in the annual collection of nationally consistent data on school students with disability.

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability provides Australian schools, parents, education authorities and the community with information about the number of students with disability in schools, where they are located and the adjustments they receive.

The national data collection on students with disability reinforces the existing obligations that schools have towards students under the Commonwealth Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005.

The national data collection counts the number of students who are supported under these obligations based on the professional judgement of teachers and their understanding and knowledge of their students.

Each year in August, principals will verify data about students in their school receiving adjustments because of disability, based on evidences in the school.


