"Where is the seed in a coconut? As a coconut is a fruit." from a Year 4 student
"Why are there 5 vowels?" from a Year 5 student
With a number of other schools in our Kingston Network we have been working on Curiosity and Powerful Learning to foster creativity in our students and help them to wonder about our world. Last week our team listened to internationally renowned Education expert Bill Lucas on how to prompt and provoke students' thinking and we look forward to implementing many of his suggestions in the coming weeks and months.

## Community Voice Survey

complete the online survey that we sent out a few weeks back. Your responses have been collated and published below. These will help form a key component to our School Review (to be held early next term) as we aim to make our school even greater.

## Review

I'm delighted to inform our school community that the immediate past Assistant Regional DirectorDenise Ramus- has agreed to be a challenge partner as part of our Review. Her role will be to help us unpack what we are doing well and areas of future focus. She has met with our Leadership team to develop some questions that will help us discover where we went right in our last school Strategic Plan and what areas we might include in our next one. This is a huge fillip for our school and I'm excited that she sees our school as one that she'd like to spend her time working closely with.

## Reports and Parent Teacher Interviews

Our new reports will be sent home on Friday next week. These are designed to be informative, simple to read and indicate student achievement levels in different areas of the curriculum. ## SCHOOL COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S REPORT <br> Mr Steve Smith

At our School Council meeting on Tuesday we reviewed the initiatives currently underway by the sub-committees, discussed the results of our community voice survey, and reviewed several policies.

Our Fundraising (Events) sub-committee is preparing our term 3 fundraising activities which includes a community BBQ at Tasman Butchers near the DFO which will be held on Saturday 26 August. More information will be sent out early in term 3. Planning for the Trivia Night in October is also underway.

Our Fundraising (Grants) sub-committee is investigating several open grants, some of which are funding towards curriculum based projects focused on the arts and sustainability. We have submitted applications for several grants that align with the projects on the master school plan. If successful we should be notified in the coming months.

A very busy two weeks for our Buildings \& Grounds sub-committee as they continue to focus on the Foundation Area and prepare for our new playground.
On Saturday 3 June we had a 'playground-prep' morning. Thank you to all the parents who donated their Saturday morning. We accomplished quite a lot including preparing the Junior Playground area for the new playground by removing concrete gutters, spreading mulch around the hall, and breaking up asphalt around the pedestrian gate entrance on Edithvale Road. Thank you to Ash and Jack from "Golden Ash"

Landscaping for completing the brick edging around the tree at the front of the school. We will soon finish this area with new asphalt to complete the path from the $2 / 3$ Building to the Foundation Area.


There is still some work to do before the construction of the new playground begins in Term 3. We will organise additional weekend activities to get us closer to completing the path at the pedestrian entrance, planting of native plants, and preparing the area for the playground with new retaining walls along the fence.

If you are interested in being involved in any of the sub-committees, please come and see me or put in a note at the office.

Our next School Council meeting is on Tuesday 25 July. This meeting will focus on the School Review. This involves analysing data from our parents, teachers, students and community to see how we measure against our current Strategic Plan (2014-2017); with the goal of creating a new Strategic Plan for the next four years.
