# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT Mr James Whitla

Congratulations to all of our amazing students, their wonderful families and our talented staff for contributing to an incredibly successful Term 2. Thank you all for your support and for helping to make us a great school. I hope that you have a wonderful and safe holiday break and we look forward to seeing our amazing school community at the start of Term 3 on Monday 17 July.

I thought that it would be worth hearing from our school's Senior Education Improvement Leader, Jen McCrabb, who recently visited our great school to see the terrific work being undertaken. Needless to say that Jen was very impressed with the quality and diversity of the learning and teaching on display as she toured our school. Below is a snapshot of what she saw (in her words) and I am proud to share this with you.

## **Edithvale Primary School**

#### **Foundation**

Foundation class worked independently on their letter task whilst the teachers roved around and assisted when required. All students were completing a Writing task, fully engaged in their work. Foundation students sat in a circle and told the teacher colours in French. All the students then praised the student who said the colour correctly in French.





### Years 1 & 2

Students could explain to me their Learning Intention in the given writing task. They knew the process of writing and how to improve their writing.



In another classroom the selected group of students were silently acting out a word (choice of three).

The rest of the class had to guess. The three words also had a definition, synonym and antonym. This was clearly explained in their Learning Intention on the mobile whiteboard.



Year 3 & 4

Many of the Year 3/4 students weren't in their classroom. Wandering through the Learning Spaces I saw many visual cues for students to access. CAFÉ Reading charts were very prominent as were Maths





Strategies cards and positive behaviour definitions. Learning Areas in this wing of the school had great 'middle' rooms that were fully utilised by the students.

I met two classes in the Library and Computer Lab. Their classroom teachers were taking the class. Students were very engaged in their learning and spoke extensively around the task at hand. These spaces were vibrant and inviting.

### Year 5/6

Many of the Year 6 Students were at Interschool Sports. Some Year 5 students were completing a CAFÉ Reading task whilst other Year 5 and 6 Students were working on their Learner Profiles for their upcoming three-way conferences. Students drafted responses about their learning in different subject areas. When revised they then put them together as a Prezi presentation. There were students spread around the BER Learning Space. It showed they really owned where they worked.

As part of our Annual French Day, on Wednesday 16 August, we are very lucky to have Terry Cole and Paddy Bath, from Le Cirque Français performing their Circus Show for us between 10.00 am and 12.30 pm in the School Hall.


