The activities were designed to challenge and encourage creative thinking in order to solve puzzles.

STUDENT ATTITUDES TO SCHOOL SURVEY

Next week, after our Year 5/6 students return from camp, they (along with our Year 4s) will complete the annual Student Attitude to School survey. Last year we used the survey results to plan to enhance our student wellbeing hour by focussing on mindfulness and resilience, purchasing more iPads and notebooks as well expanding learning experiences for our students by engaging with external experts in Science and Coding.

NAPLAN

I was immensely proud of our Year 3 and 5 students last week as they completed their NAPLAN testing too. Their collective attitude towards these assessments was excellent and they are to be commended on their efforts. Today, and over the next few weeks, we will be seeking community feedback around how well our school is travelling and what direction we might take in the next 4 years as we write the next iteration of our School's Strategic Plan.
