PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

This week School Council President, Martin Taylor, James Whitla and I met with our local Kingston Councillors, Ms Tamsin Bearsley and Mr David Evans about the traffic problem in French Avenue at school pickup and drop off times. I have also had contact with our local State member, Mr Tim Richardson about the situation and they are all working on our behalf to see if some measures can be put in place that will improve the safety of our students in this area.

Next week Naplan testing will be conducted over three days. Students in Years 3 and 5 will participate in tests such as Language Conventions (spelling, punctuation and grammar), Reading, Writing and Numeracy. Each student will receive a report later in term 3. At the school level we receive a range of reports which allow us to identify areas of improvement and as a result set goals for future learning.

In Education Week - 18—22 May there will be a number of activities planned for our current students and for those who are looking to enrol at EPS. Please mark on your calendar the afternoon of Wednesday 20 May when our school will be 'Open' to all visitors to come and see the wonderful learning that is happening in all classes at Edithvale Primary School. SPECIAL RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION IN 2015 Mr James Whitla

In 2015, Special Religious Instruction (SRI) will be offered to students in Years 2 and 3, who have returned their consent forms, and is provided by an accredited SRI instructor. Mrs Lynn Peters has undertaken training through an accredited provider (ACCESS Ministries) which includes how to fulfil her role in Government schools, focusing on the code of conduct that instructors are required to sign up to prior to receiving accreditation.

This year we only have the resources to comply with our legal requirements and ensure that our Duty of Care obligations are met, to students in Years 2 and 3. Students in those levels who DO NOT attend Special Religious Instruction will continue to be adequately supervised by a teacher and engaged in educationally valuable activities at the time that SRI is being provided to the students who have opted-in to the program. Classes will begin next week.

CROSS COUNTRY

Last week we held our cross country trials for our Year 3-6 students to enable us to select a team to represent Edithvale Primary at the District Cross Country event on 22 May. Our students ran very determinedly and received great support from their peers and an enthusiastic gathering of parents. Four of the 6 races were completed and

we are aiming to complete the remaining events next week. Those who make the team will be notified as soon as we have finished all of the events.





QKR ('quicker')

Thank you to all of those who are using QKR. The numbers have improved dramatically of late, however we still need to improve the uptake of this system, to make it more feasible for the School. The more people using it, the less we are paying in bank fees, which is important so that we can spend our funds on your children rather than spending it on these fees. Look out for a competition coming soon, where entry will be via Qkr only.

A few people have asked me whether you can use a Debit Card rather than a Credit Card on Qkr. The answer is yes, <u>however</u> the card must have the Mastercard or Visa symbol on it; and therefore have a CVC or CVV number on the back. Qkr will ask for this security number. A card that is purely a Debit Card, will not work.

If you need to delete a card, or make any changes to your account, go to the <u>start screen</u> and swipe to the right. Click on <u>settings</u> and then 'manage payment cards' for instance.

Please download OKR from the App Store on your Smartphone and start using it next time you have a School charge, or need to order from the canteen.

A couple of points to remember are:-

- Please ensure that you update your child's year level and class at the start of each year, otherwise their lunches may go to the wrong class or payments may be hard to track.
- Be careful that you select the <u>correct day</u> when ordering from the canteen. If it is after 8.30 am, you <u>will not</u> be able to order on that day. It is quite easy to select the wrong date or wrong week, so be careful, we don't want your child upset because we don't have a lunch order for them.
- All receipts stay on your phone [if you can't find them, pop in and see me and I will help you locate them]. Remember, you can always email us or ring the office to ask for a copy of your statement.

EMERGENCY DRILL

In the coming weeks, we will be conducting an EMERGENCY EVACUATION DRILL for every class in our school. Staff will explain the expectations and requirements of our students step by step and expose them to the sounds of the alarm and loud speakers. This familiarisation will help prepare our students for a full-scale OFF SITE EVACUATION DRILL that we will conduct in Term 3.

All parents on the school premises at the time of the lock down will be asked to join in this emergency procedure too, which will only take 5-10 minutes.









St John Ambulance visited our school on 29 April to deliver free First Aid in schools training to our students. Through the First Aid in Schools program, trained St John presenters


