PRINCIPAL'S REPORT—MR JAMES WHITLA

Our school and it's people are special. Thank you for helping us to create a great environment.

3 Foundation Classes: It was fantastic to reveal that we will be having three very small Foundation classes in 2018 (currently classes of 17) at our information evening last Monday. It is an exciting time for us at Edithvale Primary school as we seem to be welcoming new families into our community every 1 or 2 weeks.

Re-locatable Classrooms: Another piece of exciting news is that we will be receiving a brand new 'Mod 5' re-locatable classroom early next month. This new structure will house 2 classes of students and comes fully renovated with heating, air conditioning, new carpet and has been freshly painted. This should arrive on site in week 9 or 10 of this term, and will hopefully be ready for our students' transition week. An added bonus of having this structure is that it will initially free up some space to allow the instrumental music and French programs to have their own work spaces in 2018.

This is a \$600K investment from the Department of Education and Training and we are rapt that they are keen to support our school and the environment we are providing to our students and families.

Student Absences: In a moment of quiet reflection I started crunching the numbers of our student absences over the last few years. They made for some interesting reading too. Our average number of days absent for each student at Edithvale is 14 per year (almost identical to the State average). This means that our students, on average, over their 7 years at primary school would miss close to 100 days of school. This equates to 2 terms of learning! If this trend continued throughout their secondary school years they would miss another semester's learning and bring the total to one whole year of absence between Foundation and Year 12!

There is a strong correlation between absenteeism and performance and we encourage and urge all families to attend school as often and as regularly as possible.

Student Safety: We have taken a number of phone calls recently from concerned families in our community regarding parents and students crossing Edithvale Rd in seemingly unsafe places. We are fortunate to have our crossing guard - Norm - to help our families when crossing the Road at the lights and it is important that we all model safe behaviours to avoid any tragic accidents (like the one that was the catalyst for installing the lights in the first place) in the future. Thank you in advance for considering this.

Living Chiropractic Open Day: A huge thanks to the team at Living Chiropractic who held their 18th Annual Open Day last week and for raising upwards of \$2,000 for our great school. It was a great day with jumping castles, an animal farm, sausage sizzle and free spinal assessments! We are fortunate to have so many thoughtful and supportive people in our broader community and it was wonderful to see our school staff, councilors, parents and students attending this event.

Fun Run: Thank you to all who attended our annual Fun Run last week. We are so grateful for the support our community continues to provide the school. It was another great event that has raised vital funds towards our digital technology resources. We will let you know the amount raised when all funds are received.

Save the Date: An amazing opportunity awaits our community on 21 March next year when **Hugh van Cuylenburg** from the Resilience Project will share his story and thoughts on the value and importance of Resilience. This forms a key component of our work next year as part of student health and wellbeing and his presentation will certainly help link you in to the Resilience workbooks referred to in our 2018 Booklists. The Voluntary Financial Contributions are very important to EPS as they are used to provide educational services and to enhance resources available for student learning, recreation and comfort. In 2017, the VFC funds were used to:

- Support our ICT infrastructure (iPads and netbooks)
- ◆ Supplement classroom programs (Art, French, and Phys Ed)
- Help improve the school buildings and grounds (soft fall mulch, painting, and new play equipment)
- Provide supplies needed to attend immediate first aid needs, staff first aid training & head lice inspections.
