There was plenty to celebrate last week with our Maths Olympiad results and 3 students scoring a perfect 25/25! I also received some great feedback from a parent who was involved in the Year 5 'It's Academic" challenge at Mordialloc College last Friday, "the sportsmanship that our students showed was incredible. While other students sulked, our kids shook hands and congratulated their opponents!" These examples only reinforce what a great school we are all a part of and our combined efforts to provide a friendly, caring and dynamic learning environment that engages students in working to achieve their personal best in an atmosphere of mutual respect and cooperation.



It has been great to see the Before and After School Care Program with Team Holiday expanding in numbers this term. A reminder that this service commences at 6:45 am. Recently there have been a few students arriving at school before 8.00 am and we are encouraging parents/guardians to avail themselves of the program to ensure the safety and supervision of their children. Our teaching staff are on duty from 8:45 am.

MATH OLYMPIAD TEAM

During terms two and three, 21 of our best mathematicians from Years 4, 5 and 6 were involved in the Maths Olympiad competition.

The Maths Olympiad program is unique in that its focus is on the students' ability to solve mathematical problems in a creative manner - as opposed to simply reaching a solution using a prescribed method.

The APSMO Maths Olympiad has been operating in primary schools since 1987. Each year thousands of schools participate in the competition from around Australia and New Zealand. This year over 32 000 students were involved in the competition. The Olympiads consist of 5 separate tests held one month apart between May and September. Each test includes 5 challenging problems the students need to solve.

We are very excited to announce that our team of Olympiads came in the **top 10%** of all schools coming 77th overall. Three of our students, **Jye Holloway**, **Jess Hawker and Jacinta Gallagher** achieved a perfect score which placed them in the top 1.51%.

Emma writes a five-digit number. The thousands and hundreds digits are the same. The hundreds digit is twice the tens digit. The digit in the tenthousands place is the same as the digit in the ones place. The sum of all five digits is 19.

There are two possible values for Emma's number. What is the sum of these two numbers?

Three times Don's age plus two times Clair's age is 54. But three times Clair's age plus two times Don's age is 51.

What is the combined age of Don and Clair?

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
