## MATH OLYMPIAD TEAM

During terms two and three, 21 of our best mathematicians from Years 4, 5 and 6 were involved in the Maths Olympiad competition.

The Maths Olympiad program is unique in that its focus is on the students' ability to solve mathematical problems in a creative manner - as opposed to simply reaching a solution using a prescribed method.

The APSMO Maths Olympiad has been operating in primary schools since 1987. Each year thousands of schools participate in the competition from around Australia and New Zealand. This year over 32000 students were involved in the competition. The Olympiads consist of 5 separate tests held one month apart between May and September. Each test includes 5 challenging problems the students need to solve.

We are very excited to announce that our team of Olympiads came in the top $10 \%$ of all schools coming $77^{\text {th }}$ overall. Three of our students, Jye Holloway, Jess Hawker and Jacinta Gallagher achieved a perfect score which placed them in the top $1.51 \%$.
