## Year Level Information

## 2018 Classes

In the coming weeks, our school leadership team will be establishing our 2018 class structures. If you have any information that you believe is relevant to us about your child's learning needs that I might not be aware of, please let me know, in writing. Staff invest a great deal of time and thought into establishing classes and I'm extremely confident that we will again, get the balance right for 2018.

Constructing classes whilst balancing budget constraints can be complex due to the number of students entering and exiting our great school. In the coming weeks, our students will be given the opportunity to help us create balanced classes by nominating a number of fellow students who they feel would make good 'learning buddies' in their class for next year. We endeavour to support our students' health and wellbeing by ensuring that all students have at least ONE of their buddies join them for their learning journey.

## 2018 Fees and Parent Payments

At our most recent Finance Committee meeting we started to look at budgets, booklists and parent payments for 2018. There will be some information on the changes to the fee structure in the ensuing weeks, which reflect the need for greater access and infrastructure of digital technologies. Our Payments Policy is on our website and this includes information on how we aim to keep fees and costs at a level that ensures ALL students can access quality education at Edithvale Primary. Booklists for 2018 will be finalised and distributed shortly too.

Our school fully supports the **SunSmart** program and now that we are moving into the warmer weather, students need to wear their (named) broad brimmed or bucket hats when they are in the yard at recess and lunchtime and also when they are participating in sport or physical education classes. Willem has resigned from the School Council; his contributions and his attention to detail added great value to our discussions at the meetings and he will be missed. 
