I hope that all students, parents and staff were able to enjoy a relaxing couple of weeks away from the school environment and have returned ready for a busy and exciting 12 weeks. Transition for our 2017 Foundation students, graduation, class parties, reports and our annual Fun Run in November are all events that ensure this will be an exciting time.

In the coming weeks, our school leadership team will be establishing our 2016 class structures. If you have any information that you believe is relevant to us about your child's learning needs that I might not be aware of, please let me know, in writing. Staff invest a great deal of time and thought into establishing classes and I'm extremely confident that we will again, get the balance right for 2017.

DYSLEXIA EMPOWERMENT WEEK: 16 - 22 OCTOBER

In every school there are students who experience difficulty learning to read or write. Dyslexia Empowerment Week is targeting the misconception that these students are not good learners.

Now in it's fourth year, this national event has been created to increase awareness of dyslexia in support of the estimated 10-20% members of our community that are dyslexic.

To promote awareness and support and acknowledge the many students in our school and throughout the State who have Dyslexia, we are asking that students wear a 'touch of purple' on Friday 21 October

The following has been written by one of our students and aims to explain what it feels like to live with Dyslexia

Dear Readers,

We all get tired when we go to Extreme Air or Gravity Zone. So Imagine going to three of those sessions in a row but without enjoying it, with 2 breaks in between each session like lunch and recess. That's how a school day feels for people like me.

I have dyslexia. That means I find it hard to decode (make sense of the letters and the words they form when I am reading) and I find it almost impossible to spell, and I have difficulty with some parts of maths. What makes school so tiring for me? Concentrating so hard all the time and the fact that you feel like you have to do it, that you've got no choice!

I also have trouble with too many instructions because sometimes they sound like this to me: per favore fare tutte le cose possible immediatamente cone questo - uno, mangiare il pranzo; due leggere il libra e tre - dormire quando sei finisce. Did you get that? Off you go & do it then!

I hope you understand how hard it is to have dyslexia when you're at school, but it also comes with gifts that you might not know about. For example, all dyslexics have a very creative brain, like Albert Einstein. Although we may not have as clever a brain as he did we can all achieve our dreams if we try because trying is half the battle! And I'd like to end with a saying from Albert Einstein: "if you measure the intelligence of a fish by its ability to climb a tree then of course the fish will look stupid!"

SUNSMART

A timely reminder ...



If you can see skin, UV can reach it.

Between *September and the end of April 2017*, please ensure all children:

- Wear cool, loose fitting clothing that covers as much skin as possible
- Wear a sun protective hat for all outdoor activities
- Apply SPF 30 or higher broad spectrum sunscreen during the day (please see sunscreen tips below)
- Have access to shady play spaces
- Wear wrap-around sunglasses labelled AS 1067 (if practical).

SUNSCREEN TIPS



- Regular use of sunscreen has been shown to reduce the incidence of melanoma and squamous cell carcinoma, both in the short and long term.
- Choose SPF 30 or higher broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen. Make sure it is within its use-by date and is stored below 30 degrees. It is best to apply a generous amount of sunscreen to any exposed skin around 20 minutes before going outdoors. Sunscreen should be reapplied every two hours even if the stated level of water resistance is 4 hours.
- Store sunscreen with lunchboxes and/ or hats so when children grab their lunch or hat before going outdoors, they will also be reminded to apply sunscreen. If sunscreen is kept in the cooler section of the lunchbox, it will be cold when applying especially nice on a hot, summer's day.
