# **FLU SEASON IS UPON US**

We are continuing to have confirmed cases of Influenza A and B reported at school. Please seek medical advice if your child/children are showing any symptoms.

The most common symptoms of the flu are:

- Sudden appearance of a high fever (38 degrees or more)
- A dry cough
- Body aches (especially in the head, lower back and legs)
- Feeling extremely weak and tired (and not wanting to get out of bed)
- Other symptoms can be:
- Aching behind the eyes
- Loss of appetite
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose



The flu is a highly contagious viral infection that can cause severe illness and life threatening complications, including pneumonia. The flu is spread by contact with fluids from coughs and sneezes.

Children should not attend school until they are well.
