PARENT PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS

Dear Parents & Carers

Edithvale Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of our parent payment arrangements for 2021.

Please find the fee schedule for [Year 4](#) attached, along with your booklist for 2021. Our classroom teachers carefully prepare our booklists, to reflect the items required to deliver their planned lessons. For consistency and ease of purchase we prefer that you purchase online through the COS Portal, however you can purchase items from other suppliers such as OfficeWorks, if you wish to; as long as you purchase the equivalent items & brands shown on the booklists.

Please follow the instructions on the booklist page and order before 6 December to secure free delivery.

Edithvale Primary School makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all parents.

Edithvale Primary School provides a comprehensive, creative and challenging educational program for all of our students in a supportive and caring environment. A clear specification of the items we are able to charge for, including descriptions and outline of costs within the three payment categories has been provided to all families along with their booklist.

We are heavily reliant on the Voluntary Financial Contributions we receive, to provide exciting learning opportunities and a safe working environment for all members of our Edithvale Primary School community. Your financial support enables us to provide a wide range of programs and enhance our resources such as Digital Technologies and our incredible STEM and Robotics programs. These contributions allow us to provide facilities and programs that are not otherwise provided for through the Department's Student Resource Package.

Financial Support for Families

Edithvale Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund that is available to families who hold a health care card or are on a Centrelink pension. Ask at the office for more information.
- a second hand uniform shop that is available at school, every Tuesday between 3.15 pm and 4.15 pm, with good quality second hand uniform available at good prices.
- State Schools Relief. This is an organisation associated with Schools, who can supply school uniform, books and shoes to eligible students. Again, ask at the office for more information.
- Local community supports are sometimes available to help families suffering with financial hardship. We can source these for you if required.



Parents/Guardians experiencing financial hardship should make contact with Mr Whitla or Mr McMaster, who are our parent payment contacts. Parents/Guardians can communicate with them by phone (9772 1393), email (edithvale.ps@education.vic.gov.au) or in person, about their financial situation and related difficulties to discuss their options and arrangements available to them. We know it can be difficult to discuss this hardship, and ensure you that we will always treat your situation with the utmost of confidence. We may also discretely approach families who we think may need support and special payment arrangements to be made.

Payment Methods

We prefer payment to be made via the 'COS' Portal when ordering your Booklist for the start of the year; however, we will also accept payment using QKR, Bpay, EFTPOS, Internet Banking, Cash, Cheque Credit Card, at the office or CompassPay. For more expensive items such as camps, we will have a payment / instalment plan available.

Refunds

Edithvale Primary School refund guidelines are listed below:

- Where the school is charged for the provision of a program or service as a bulk cost and not per head cost, no refund can be given.
- Where a "per head" fee is charged, a refund can be given.
- Where there is a combination of a bulk charge and a "per head" charge in an excursion Eg: visit to the zoo - bus charge is bulk cost. Entry fee is per head cost. Only the "per head" component can be refunded.
- All claims for reimbursements must be made in writing within 14 days of the event.
- Points 3 and 4 to be included on all excursions/camps/visiting groups/services notices where there are charges.
- All refunds / reimbursements to be authorised by the Principal.
- If a camp or excursion is cancelled or altered by the school, or a student is no longer able to attend part or all of the camp or excursion, our school will consider requests for partial or full refunds of payments made by parents/carers on a case-by-case basis taking into account the individual circumstances.
- Generally we will not be able to refund payments made for costs that have already been paid where those funds have already been transferred or committed to a third party and no refund is available to the school. Where possible, we will provide information about refunds to parents/carers at the time of payment.

The following is a summary of the main principles of the Department of Education's Parent Payments Policy:



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements as outlined in the Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

- Schools do not ask parents to pay for school operating costs (e.g. utility costs) or general and unspecified charges.
- Schools request payments from parents under three categories:

FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and upload their arrangements on their school's public website for transparency.
